GOVERNMENT AND STATE PHYSICIANS DISCUSS INFANTILE PARALYSIS.

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES TAKEN AT MASON CITY

No Known Successful Treatment and Steps Taken to Prevent Further Spread by Quarantine—Few Females Victims of Epidemic at Mason City—Dust Theory Exploded.

Mason City, Aug. 1.—Physicians and the Iowa board of health with Dr. W. H. Frost, of the United States marine hospital service, held a conference here in the office of Dr. McGilchrist. The meeting resulted in something of a united action among the physicians concerning treatment of the disease known as infantile paralysis. A press committee was appointed which has promised to keep the public posted. A committee was also appointed to place the matter before the Commercial Club to secure funds for stamping out the disease.

Is a Germ Disease. Work done in the United States and in European countries within the last year has proved that this disease is due to a germ and is communicable from persons who have the disease to monkeys. The germs which cause the disease must be extremely small, probably too small to be seen with the most powerful microscope.

DRAYS WHICH HAUL LIQUORS TO THIRSTY CITIZENS VIOLATE STATE LAWS.

MUST GET LICENSE OR QUIT, RULES LAWYER-MAYOR

Logan's Chief Executive Issues Ultimatum to Draymen of Town Who Act as Go-Between For Brewers and Private Citizens, Discovers an Un-known Statute.

Logan, Aug. 1.—From the deep tangle which enmeshes the myriad liquor laws of Iowa some light of the bar (bar is used in the legal sense) has developed a clause which makes hauling liquor from the freight shed to the cellar of the thirsty a violation of statute and that individual who formerly depended upon the United States mails and the railroad companies for his supply of drinkables from the hop crop has been dealt a solar plexus blow.

Draymen Prohibited. Calling the draymen of the city before him he issued his proclamation—also his ultimatum—namely and to-wit: If you haul liquor to the one who orders it you are no better than the man who sells liquor over the bar to the one who orders it; therefore, either you must get a license to deal in liquor or you must quit dealing in liquor.

Wouldn't Haul Empties. The fear of law was sent so deeply into the soul of one that he refused even to haul "empties." For the sake of the unutilized it is explained, "empties" are those bottles which, when they come, carried beer, but which have been emptied.
