ON LONG RIDE FOR WAGER.  
Glenrock, Wyo., Young Man On Horseback Ride to Chicago Reaches Here.  
Riding from Glenrock, Wyo., to Chicago on horseback on a wager of \$450 that he could make the trip in twenty-six days, Thomas J. Brubacker, of Glenrock, reached the city at 3:45 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. After remaining here for a short time he left for the east, expecting to make Tama a beat before nightfall.  
Brubacker left Glenrock, a small town north of Cheyenne on Sept. 1, in order to win the bet he must be in Chicago by 3 o'clock of the afternoon of next Monday, Sept. 8. Brubacker was confident that he would get there. He carries a message of greeting from Governor Brooks of Wyoming, to Mayor Busse, of Chicago.  
Brubacker came from Ames Tuesday. He started with two horses, riding one and leading the other. At Sioux City one of his mounts became crippled and although he used the animal until he reached Jefferson he was forced to leave it there and go on with the single horse, which shows the marks of travel. Up to Sioux City, which is 720 miles from Glenrock, the rider averaged 61 miles a day. He did not know what his average had been since then.

#### RHODES FAIR OPENS.

Splendid Weather Greets Twentieth Annual Fair of Eden District.  
With splendid weather the twentieth annual fair of the Eden District Agricultural Society opened at Rhodes today. The fair continues thru Thursday and Friday. The attendance today was good, but it is expected that Thursday and Friday will be the big days, provided the weather is favorable. The list of entries in all of the departments is large, fully up to or even larger than any previous year.  
Tuesday was entry day at the fair and there was no admission charged. The program for Thursday includes the free attractions, baseball games and stock judging.

#### TO HOLD UNIQUE WEDDING.

"Hallelujah" Ceremony to Be Performed For Benefit of Building Fund.  
A "hallelujah" wedding will be solemnized at the Salvation Army hall on North First street on the evening of Wednesday, Oct. 19, at 8 o'clock, when the church people of the city, whose identity will not be known until the time of the ceremony, will be united in marriage by Brigadier Alexander McMillan, of Des Moines.  
The event will be open to the public, but an admission fee of 25 cents will be charged, the receipts to be applied to the army building fund. Members of the local and other corps will act as groom's men, bridesmaids, flower girls and ushers.

#### FIX MATRON'S COMPENSATION.

Caretaker of County Rest Room Will Receive \$25 Per Month.  
The compensation for the matron of the county rest room, in the basement of the court house, was fixed this morning by the board of supervisors at \$25 per month. Applications for the position will be received by the board until the next meeting in October. Until a matron is appointed Miss Tomlinson, who has been caretaker of the rest

room since it was established, will be retained. The supervisors have decided the county will pay the matron.

#### AWARD COAL CONTRACTS.

George Gregory and Consumers' Fuel Company Get Contracts.  
The board of supervisors this morning awarded the county coal contracts for the coming year. The contract for coal at the county farm was awarded to the Gregory Coal, Coke and Lime Company, at \$2.85 per ton for mine run coal. The contract for city delivery was awarded to the Consumers' Fuel Company, their bid being \$2.25 for steam coal, and \$4.00 for lump.

#### VERDICT FOR MRS. WOODS.

Jury Awards Plaintiff \$600 in Personal Injury Case.  
The case of Catherine Woods versus the city of Marshalltown and Ghinre & Co., went to the jury at 2:30 Tuesday afternoon, and a verdict for the plaintiff was returned at about 7 o'clock Tuesday evening. By the verdict Mrs. Woods is awarded damages in the sum of \$600 against the city and Ghinre & Co. Mrs. Woods sued for \$3,000.
