DRAWN ON CINCINNATI INSTITUTION, FOR \$750 AND CASHED AT BOONE.

BANK PEOPLE WILL NOT LOSE MONEY, HOWEVER

Stranger Presents Draft For Collection Thru Kentucky Bank to First National and Concern Upon Which It Was Drawn Wires Warning Too Late—Pinkerton's Aid Invoked.

About two weeks ago a nice appearing man called at the First National Bank in this city and presented a draft for \$750 and asked the First National people to collect it, the draft being drawn on a Kentucky bank.


