NOTICE OF SPECIAL CITY ELECTION. TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MARSHALLTOWN, IOWA.

local telephone service shall not exceed the following schedule of rates: BUSINESS RATES. Individual line desk 'phones, per month \$2.75

SECTION 6-BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, THAT THE MERCHANTS, MECHANICS AND FARMERS' TELEPHONE COMPANY or its assigns, shall give bond in the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000) as soon as work on the plant has begun

SECTION 7-SAID MERCHANTS, MECHANICS AND FARMERS' TELEPHONE COMPANY, its successors or assigns, shall pay any and all damages that may accrue from the laying, repairing, removing or operating their poles, wires, cables, conductors, aerials and systems.

SECTION 8-IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED, THAT for and in consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted the said MERCHANTS, MECHANICS AND FARMERS' TELEPHONE COMPANY, its successors or assigns, shall furnish and maintain free of charge one telephone in each of the public school buildings and one in each of the city hospitals.

SECTION 9-The franchise hereby granted shall have no force, validity or effect until a proposition for the same has been submitted to a vote of the electors of the City of Marshalltown at the next general election as provided for by the Code of Iowa.

SECTION 10-The rights herein granted shall not be inclusive but the council and citizens reserve the right to grant similar franchises to other persons or corporations.

SECTION 11-This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, publication as by law provided, and its ratification and adoption by the qualified electors at the election to be held for that purpose as above provided.

SECTION 12-All ordinances and parts of ordinances in any manner in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
