WATER WORKS COMMITTEE OF COUNCIL TO INSPECT WAVERLY PLANT.

Thinks Water Power is Not Feasible Here, and Believes Council Had Better Stop—Mack Reports on Virtues of New Elevated Tank—Coal Bill \$5,000 Per Year With Tank.

The water works committee of the city council, together with E. Z. Mack, superintendent of mains, and Hans Madsen, superintendent of the pumping station, will go to Waverly within the next week to inspect the new water power that has been installed there after repeated trials to find something suitable to the needs of the city.

The water works committee favored the inspection in a report to the council, and in Mr. Clark's motion that the committee conduct the inspection all voted in favor of the motion.

COMBINATIONS ARE WORKED; SAFE DOORS NOT FORCED

Eight Dollars in Silver in Cash Box Containing Paper Money Not Taken—Thief Entered Thru Unlocked Window of Rear Office—Thief Committed Between 6:15 and 7:45 Last Night.
