MARSHALLTOWN TIES EAST HIGH

FAST DES MOINES TEAM FAILS TO WIN FROM LOCAL SCHOOL IN SPECTACULAR GAME.

VISITORS SUFFER FROM MANY HEAVY PENALTIES

Both Teams Often Penalized For Players Being Off Side and Holding in the Line - Marshalltown Makes Great Stand On Her One Yard Line - Details of the Game.

In the annual football game between the Marshalltown and East Des Moines high schools, at the fair grounds Saturday afternoon, was played one of the best and most spectacular games ever seen on the local grounds.

Apparently Des Moines had the greater advantage in weight, but Marshalltown handled the ball in better shape, especially during the first half.

During the first two periods fumbling and penalties imposed for holding in the line and players being off-side cost the Des Moines team many yards. Their handling of punts during the first half was very poor.

Both Teams Penalized. Numerous penalties were imposed on both teams, the officials being alert in their watchfulness for violations of the rules.

Gabelman's Punting Best. During the second half Marshalltown resorted largely to punting and in this department Gabelman greatly excelled Brophy. Marshalltown gaining great ground on the exchange. Gabelman also outclassed the Des Moines players in handling punts.

Hatcher in Stellar Role. During the second period Hatcher was sent into the line for repeated gains. Early in the quarter he singled right end for forty yards, carrying the ball to Des Moines' 25-yard line.

Des Moines Loses Chances. Twice in the second half Des Moines had opportunities to score. Taking the ball from the kickoff they rushed to Marshalltown's 16-yard line, where they were halted.

Interferes With Tackler. In the last period Brophy's interference with Hatcher, as he was about to tackle the man with the ball, cost Des Moines her last chance of scoring.

Team Greatly Improved. The Marshalltown team has greatly improved since its game with North Des Moines, and as it played Saturday would be able to make the leading high schools in the state display their best football to win.

Des Moines failed to make substantial gains thru the line and the tackling was cleaner and more certain. Stewart, a light man for center position, easily outplayed his big 211-pound opponent.

Hatcher, Gabelman and Ray and Roscoe Packer started for the local team, and Davidson, C. Mullen, R. Mullen and Brophy played the better game for Des Moines.

The local school looked upon the game in the light of a victory, and in celebration of the event a big bonfire was built on South Center street in the evening.

CENTRAL STRIKE IS OF SHORT DURATION

MASTER MECHANIC WILLIAM GILL AND CARMEN'S COMMITTEE REACH SETTLEMENT.

The strike of the 180 men employed in the car and paint shops of the Iowa Central was of short duration. At a conference of Master Mechanic William Gill and the grievance committee, which was held Saturday evening, a settlement of the trouble which was the direct cause of the strike, was reached.

Work was resumed where it was left off Friday, and Master Mechanic Gill said this morning that work was progressing as smoothly as usual. The men who had been taken from the shop and had been cared for elsewhere, General Manager W. G. Bierd did not come to the city, as it was thought that he might.
