HAMILL WANTS PARDON

MAN CONVICTED WITH WEEMS TO ASK LEGISLATURE FOR FREEDOM.

HAS BEEN LONG INSANE, IS NOW RECOVERING

Eleven Pardon Cases to Come Before Legislature at Next Session—Des Moines Anti-Saleon Forces in Earnest in Their Campaign—Official Vote on Congressmen.

Des Moines, Nov. 29.—John G. Hamill, who was convicted in Polk county of murder and given the death sentence, will ask the state legislature to recommend a pardon at the next session.

Hamill has been for many years an inmate of the insane section of the reformatory at Anamosa. He was convicted with George Weems and George Kraut of the murder of Conductor Redpath in Des Moines. Kraut had so arranged it that he was let off with a light sentence, which he served.

Hamill became violently insane. In recent years he had partially regained his reason and in the opinion of the parole board he would not be a dangerous man out provided someone would agree to care for him. His plea for pardon will be based on the theory that if Weems was innocent then Hamill also was innocent.

That the anti-saleon forces of Des Moines are in dead earnest in their determination to shut up the open saloons in Des Moines was shown this week when they brought Evangelist William A. Sunday to the city for one speech to arouse the people against signing the consent petitions.
