DRAINAGE MEN OBJECT

STATE ASSOCIATION DOES NOT LIKE COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATIONS.

CONSULTING ENGINEER GIVEN TOO GREAT POWER

Association Appoints Committee to Confer With Waterway Commission and Formulate Recommendations For Law Change—Drainage and Its Relation to Soils Discussed.

Mason City, Feb. 15.—An exceedingly interesting program marked the opening of the annual meeting of the Iowa State Drainage Association.

One of the recommendations is that the governor appoint a drainage and waterway commissioner, whose services shall be available to supervise free of charge, when he is thus employed.

J. M. Blake was against another feature of the recommendation, and that was to have the county or state stand behind the credit of the drainage district.

The fact was emphasized by several of the speakers that in order to drain intelligently you have to know your soil.

Engineer James A. King, in an address, inspired the association with the necessity of a more general publicity of the drainage problems.

George M. Thompson, of Grand Junction, read a paper on history of drainage, claiming that it was used in the first century of the christian era.
