

MARSHALLTOWN TEAM THIRD IN RELAY MEET

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES MAKE GOOD SHOWING AT DES MOINES.

FINISH SECOND IN MILE AND TWO MILE EVENTS

Beaten Only by Crack West Des Moines Team, Which Holds State Records—Unfavorable Weather Prevents Record-Breaking Performances—Part Carried Out in Rain Storm.

By winning second place in the mile and the two-mile relay races, the Marshalltown high school relay teams won third honors for their school in the big Drake relay carnival at Des Moines Saturday afternoon.

The meet, one of the best ever held in the state, as considered from the high class of the entries, was marred by bad weather, a portion of the program being carried out in a rain storm.

The Marshalltown team, entered in the three high school events, finished second to the fast West Des Moines team in the mile and the two-mile relay races.

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West High also won the shuttle race, with Greenfield second, and East Des Moines third.
