

SEAGER-JOHNSON DECREE FILED

Judge Cummings Approves Report of Accountants After Changing It. The stipulation of settlement and the report of the accountants in the case of Charles H. Seager, landlord, vs. J. W. Johnson, his tenant, etc., were approved and affirmed after being changed in part by Judge B. F. Cummings in the decree filed in the case Friday.

The charge against Johnson for "keeping the mill" was reduced from \$90 to \$45. The Gilman Savings Bank was authorized to pay Johnson the sum shown to be due him by the accounts, less one-half of the court costs, \$25 to E. W. Virden, and \$36 to J. G. Etzel.
