TIGHT MONEY MARKET SAID TO CREATE BAD BUSINESS POLICY.

INSURANCE COMMISSIONERS RESOLVE AGAINST STATUTE

Would Make It Impossible For Abuse of Credit of Widows and Orphans of Future—Supreme Court to Attempt to Dispose of Iowa's Herd of Wild Deer.

Special to Times-Republican. Des Moines, Sept. 25.—Emory H. English, insurance commissioner, has returned from Asheville, where he attended the annual meeting of insurance commissioners of the states and provinces.
