MISSING PRECINCTS CHANGE NO RESULTS

SCOTT'S PLURALITY DECREASED AS EXPECTED BY FIRST WARD VOTE.

EDGAR AND LYNCH BOTH SHOW INCREASED LEADS

Total Vote on Head of Ticket 5,235, 1,482 Under What it was Last Presidential Year—Cummins' Plurality 1,431; Clarke's 1,133; Good's 1,525—Complete Vote of County.

No results of Tuesday's election were changed with the receipt of the complete returns. The two precincts missing up to noon Wednesday—Vienna township and the First ward—came in during the afternoon.

The plurality of Ray P. Scott, republican candidate for county attorney, was cut down, as was expected, with the First ward in. Joseph G. Edgar, democrat, for sheriff, and Charles R. Lynch, democrat, for supervisor, both showed increased leads with the addition of the vote of the missing precincts.

The total vote on the head of the ticket was 5,235, as compared to 6,717 for president in 1912, a decrease of 1,482.

Cummins' Plurality 1,431. Senator Albert B. Cummins' plurality in the county is 1,431. There was only one the precinct, Vienna, missing in the senatorial vote, and it gave Cummins 65 to Connolly's 22. This increased Cummins' plurality from 1,388 to 1,431, and gave the senator a majority of 885. The vote by precincts:

Cummins' plurality—1,431. Schenk, progressive candidate for senator, received 84 votes; McCrillis, socialist, 153; Christian, prohibition, 134; and Spurgeon, independent, 178. This gives Cummins a majority of 885.

Governor's Plurality Greater. The same missing precinct accorded to Governor Clarke 71 votes, to John T. Hamilton's 25, increasing Clarke's plurality from 1,086 to 1,133, and giving him a majority of 738. The vote:

Clarke's plurality—1,133. White, progressive, received 103; Wilson, socialist, 158; and Smith, prohibition, 138. Clarke's majority is 738.

Big Gain For Edgar in First. Altho Joseph G. Edgar lost Vienna township by 6 votes, he gained 230 in the First ward, and this sent his plurality from 803 to 1,027. The vote by precincts:

Edgar's plurality—1,027. Scott's Plurality Reduced. The conditions were just reversed in

the county attorney contest, the missing precinct of Vienna going to Scott, 57 to 31, and the First ward to Johnson, 292 to 178. The increase in the Johnson vote reduced Scott's plurality from 478 to 389. The vote:

Scott's plurality—389. **Lynch Takes Both.** C. R. Lynch, democrat, for supervisor, took both of the missing precincts from D. C. Maytag. Lynch's home precinct, Vienna, gave him 79 votes to Maytag's 16, and the First ward gave Lynch 250 to Maytag's 140, and the city by a plurality of 493. In the county Lynch's plurality was increased from 623 to 806. The vote:
