


AMERICAN TROOPS AND ARTILLERY ARE READY FOR INSTANT ACTION AT NACO IF DANGER CONTINUES

MANY JEWS SERVING IN BRITISH ARMY SOME AS OFFICERS

London, Dec. 8.—British Jewry is justifiably proud of the response made by its members to the call to arms.

No fewer than 450 Jews are holding commissions in the army and navy. These figures are striking, as, allowing for the large number of Jews whose alien birth debars them from service, the quota which Jewry should supply is about 2,200.

Two Hundred Among Canadians. There are 200 Jews among the Canadians at Salisbury Plain, many of them men who emigrated from Roumania and Russia to Canada and have taken up arms for the empire of their adoption.

With the expediency force in France at least 1,000 Jews are serving, of whom more than 100 are in the H. A. C. In the A. S. C. Jewish members of a well known catering firm are giving their special knowledge.

The response to the call has not been confined to any section of the Jewish community. Fully half of the volunteers are sons of alien parents. On the other hand, the great Jewish families of England have contributed their quota.

Every eligible member of the Rothschild family, the lay heads of the community, is with the colors, while the sons of the Jewish clergy have enlisted as a man. In the Jewish Lad's Brigade—an organization akin to the Church Lad's Brigade—there were fifty officers at the outbreak of war.

Naturally the Jewish community is proud of the fact that three Jewish officers and one private have been mentioned in dispatches. Lieut. Marx, one of England's most brilliant aviators, is also of Jewish origin.

Many Killed or Wounded. Honor is not without scars, and against many a name on the chaplain's list there appears the letters K. W. or M.—killed, wounded, missing. Early in the war Alexis de Gunzburg, a member of a family widely known and honored, gave his life for England while serving as an interpreter attached to the Royal Horse Guards.

Queen Alexandra Active. Mother of King George Takes Prominent Part in Public Affairs. [Correspondence of Associated Press.] London, Dec. 8.—Plans of King George for a great celebration of the 70th birthday of his mother, Queen Alexandra, were entirely set aside this year, on account of the war and she spent the day quietly.

Among the guests who had been invited to attend the festivities planned were Emperor William and the empress. In connection with the queen's birthday it was recalled by many that the marriage of Queen Alexandra was the first ceremonial function which the emperor ever was allowed to attend.

It has been her majesty's custom for many years to spend her birthday at her Sandringham home surrounded by her family. Usually, too, her daughter, Queen Maud of Norway, has extended her English visit until after the birthday.

CLEARY ACQUITTED OF MURDER. Democratic Politician Freed of Guilt in Killing Son-in-Law.

New City, N. Y., Dec. 22.—William V. Cleary, town clerk of Haverstraw and democratic leader in Rockland county, was acquitted by a jury in the supreme court here Saturday night of the charge of murder in the first degree, on which he was tried for the killing of Eugene M. Newman, his son-in-law.

Announcement of the verdict was the signal for a demonstration by Cleary's friends, who had remained in the courtroom while the jury was deliberating.

When the jury sent word that it had agreed Cleary was brought in from the jail adjoining the court house. He showed the effects of the strain he had been under after the jury's retirement.

Mrs. Cleary, who was in the courtroom when the announcement came, was overcome by a nervous shock. Her extreme paleness and deep agitation attracted District Attorney Hagan's attention. He requested that she be taken from the room.

Applause followed the announcement. Cleary seemed dazed at first and unable to comprehend the significance of the jury's finding. When he regained his composure he asked permission to thank the jury. It was granted, and he shook hands with each one of the twelve men, saying: "Gentlemen, I thank you for your merciful and righteous verdict."
