MILLER WINS CASE SUPREME COURT AFFIRMS DECISION AGAINST HARRISON COUNTY.

BRIDGE APPROACH NOT PROPERLY PROTECTED

Accident, Which Resulted in Plaintiff Sustaining Injuries, Result of Un-guarded Approach—Held That With Reasonable Safeguards Accident Might Not Have Been Possible.

Special to Times-Republican. Logan, Sept. 24.—An important decision has just been handed down by the supreme court of Iowa in the case entitled Miller vs. Harrison county.

Miller brought an action to recover damages for injuries sustained when he went off the earth approach to a county bridge southwest of Woodbine, and fell with his carriage twenty feet to the bottom of the gulch below.

Affirms Lower Court's Verdict. The attorneys for the defense contended that the earth construction, thirty-four feet long and three feet high, immediately west of the bridge, was neither an approach nor was it connected with the bridge but formed a part of the highway and as a consequence the county was not liable for the accident and injuries received by Mr. Miller.

TO GAIN FREEDOM FROM IOWA PRISON.

SERVING LIFE SENTENCE FOR KILLING HUSBAND

Convicted of Poisoning Husband, Former Des Moines Railroad Engineer—Now 60 Years of Age and Model Prisoner—Friends of Charles Thomas Seek New Evidence For Pardon Plea.

Des Moines, Sept. 24.—Betsy Smith, serving a life term at Anamosa for the murder of her husband in Des Moines in 1894, was denied a pardon yesterday when Governor Clarke approved the report of the state board of parole which recommended that no clemency be extended.

Attempts to secure a pardon for the woman, who is now sixty years old, have twice been made before the legislature. The last time was before the Thirty-second general assembly.

Charles Thomas Wants Pardon. Claiming they have discovered new evidence to show that attempts were made to secure a pardon for the murder of Mabel Scofield, have renewed efforts to secure his pardon.

It is claimed this evidence was needed to establish the connecting links in the state's chain of murder evidence.


