SUCH IS OPINION OF F. E. NORTHUP, ATTORNEY FOR NADE LONG.

HABEAS CORPUS CASE CONTINUED THIRTY DAYS

Continuation of Hearing in District Court, in Attempt to Prevent Long Being Removed to Kentucky, Leaves Barber in Custody of Court—Application for Requisition Not Filed.

It looks like it had piffled out, but you can't tell. Such was the opinion of F. E. Northup regarding the effort of Knox County, Kentucky, to return Nade Long to Barbourville, Ky., to answer an indictment charging forgery, after Northup returned from Des Moines. Northup went to Des Moines expecting to resist an application for a requisition for Long that Sheriff Sam L. Lewis, of Knox county, said Thursday he would file Friday forenoon in the office of Governor Clarke.

"Lewis did not show up," was Northup's only comment on the failure of the Kentucky sheriff to appear at the governor's office as he had agreed. Northup did not know until after he got to Des Moines that Lewis had left for Kentucky the night before.

Habeas Corpus Case Continued. Northup secured a continuation of the hearing on the application for a writ of habeas corpus issued against Long for thirty days this forenoon. The continuation of hearing on this application leaves Long technically in the custody of the court and subject to its order at any time. Long is also under bond issued by Mayor Millard when Long was held under a charge of being a fugitive from justice after Chief of Police Breckel had received a warrant charging forgery from Kentucky.
