down in the hearts of the men and women who took up residence on the lands relinquished by the Indian inhabitants lay the human qualities which make a nation strong and virtuous. To most pioneers, work in such west-

ern wilds as Iowa four score years ago meant a change of sky but not a change of fundamental practices and habits.—From an article by Mr. Jacob Van der Zee, published by the State Historical Society of Iowa.
