

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TELEPHONE CASE AFFIRMED

Albion Controversy Over Bond Decided Against Dr. Mantle.

The supreme court Thursday affirmed the ruling of the lower court in directing a verdict of \$102.50 against Dr. W. B. Mantle, J. C. Koonz, and M. W. McKibben in a lawsuit growing out of litigation over telephone services and lines in Albion.

Originally in the litigation Dr. Mantle brought suit for an injunction against the Albion-Marshall Telephone Company, Iowa Valley Mutual Telephone Company and the Home Mutual Telephone Company to prevent them from interfering with his service.

An injunction was issued after Dr. Mantle and the other plaintiffs had posted a bond to indemnify the defendants, Dennis, et al., for any damages, if the injunction should be dissolved.
