NAVAL PROGRAM NOT TO BE CURTAILED

WILSON'S RECOMMENDATIONS TO BE ADOPTED WITH LITTLE OPPOSITION.

BATTLE CRUISERS HAVE RIGHT OF WAY IN FAVOR

Program May Be Changed to Supplement Dreadnaughts With Smaller and Faster Vessels—Submarine Losing Popularity Among Lawmakers—Naval Supporters United.

[Special Correspondence.] Washington, Jan. 25.—Altho President Wilson is going to appeal to the country, in his forthcoming trip, to back up his program of national defense, there is at least one part of the administration program which is not in serious danger of being beaten in congress.

This is the naval program which the president has recommended for the coming year. That is to say, the program of construction for the first year which the president advocated in his message to both houses Dec. 7.

Hearings in Progress. Hearings are now going on in the naval committee on the naval bill. The program of construction for the coming fiscal year is being discussed. It may be two months before the bill is reported, as the committee is going ahead with much slowness.
