TO INCREASE BOILER CAPACITY OF PLANT

PUBLIC UTILITIES TO PUT HORSE POWER OF PLANT TO MAXIMUM.

WILL ADD FOURTH 500 H. P. BOILER

Because of Demand For Boiler Tube Material, Delivery May Be Delayed Until Mid-Summer—War Prices May Hold Up Extensions of Street Car Line—Vancleve Wants Electricity.

Plans for increasing the boiler power of the local plant of the Iowa Railway and Light Company have resulted in an order being placed for a 500 horse power boiler that will increase the boiler power capacity to its maximum of 2,000 horse power.

Its installation will mean the replacing of the last of the old boilers in the plant, at the time the Iowa Railway and Light Company bought it, with the last of a battery of four immense new boilers.

To Be Installed in Summer. Because of the demand for metals that the war has produced, and especially for boiler tube material, it is not expected that the boiler will be delivered before the middle of the summer.

Because of the advance of price of steel rails and other materials, Munson said it was very probable that the company would not build any street car line extensions this season, except the line over the viaduct to the south side.

From Vancleve comes word that there is talk here of the town being lighted with electricity from the local plant of the Iowa Railway and Light Company.
