BRADFORD FOR SENATE

Senior Member of Bradford & Johnson Democratic Candidate—George Sherman Party's Choice For Representative.

Conferences of democrats of the county have resulted in the county party's managers settling on their candidates for the legislative ticket. As candidate for senator they have chosen T. F. Bradford, senior member of the law firm of Bradford & Johnson. For representative they have named George Sherman, former member of the city council, and active in the party ranks.

The caucus group is considering available candidates for the county ticket, but action was taken on the legislative ticket because the candidate nomination papers must be circulated and filed soon. Candidates for county offices have until May 6 to file their nomination papers.

Altho party candidates for all the county offices have not been selected, two are in the field and will be nominated by the party for their respective offices. These are Sheriff J. G. Edgar and Supervisor C. R. Lynch, whom they will be candidates to succeed themselves. There is no certainty yet regarding candidates for other county offices.

Prepare For Big Blast at Quarry

Deep toned booming, like heavy cannonading, will be heard in this city probably this afternoon or Wednesday. Boom will follow boom in quick succession for a seemingly long period. Residents need not be alarmed. Neither Zeppelins nor guns of many centimeters will be responsible for the noise. It is only due to the explosions of blasts at the Northwestern quarry.

Preparations have been under way for several days to set off a series of the heaviest charges cut loose in the quarry in a long time. Late Monday it was thought the charges would be ready for the electric spark this afternoon or evening.

Twenty-six 100 pound charges of giant powder are to be exploded in the south face of the quarry wall that has a height of fifty or sixty feet. The charges have been spaced along the rocky ledge for a distance of 400 or 500 feet, and the purpose is to blast away the whole face and get it on the floor of the quarry, ready to handle to the crusher.

Boys Taken to Eldora. George Gregory Johnson, colored, aged 11 years, who was paroled from the state industrial school about two years ago, was returned to Eldora this forenoon by Sheriff Edgar. Since the death of his nearest relative the boy has been living in the Grant Jackson and C. P. Gilmore families. He was returned to the school principally because he has no home.

William Petrie, who confessed to forgery in the district court, was also taken to the industrial school this forenoon.

Boys Pass Bible "Exams." All but seven of the Y. M. C. A. boys who took the bible examinations Saturday passed successfully, according to Paul McKee, who corrected the papers. Thirty-eight boys took the tests, and thirty-one received a grade of 65 or higher. Many of the grades were above 90. The marks are sent to New York, together with the examination papers, and are regarded on a basis of 75 as the passing mark. The boys who receive a grade of 75 or higher are then given a certificate.
