IOWA BUTTER FAVORED

PRODUCT MAY FIND ITS WAY TO TABLES OF DISCRIMINATING NEW YORK TRADE.

TRADE MARK TO PAVE WAY TO HIGH PRICES

Big Eastern Firm Preparing to Handle Output of Creameries Entitled to Use State Label—Quality and Not Cost Determines Market—Must Not Score Less Than 93.

Des Moines, May 13.—Iowa trade mark butter may find its way to the tables of the most discriminating of the New York trade where quality and not price determines the market.

W. B. Barney, state food and dairy commissioner, took occasion to call on one of the biggest retail butter and milk concerns in New York City.

Must Score High. To win the right to use the state trade mark for butter the butter, as scored by state dairy inspectors, must not score less than 93 and the creameries themselves must score 93 or above.

Butter sold under the trade mark must be manufactured from cream which has been pasteurized either in the form of milk or cream. Pasteurization must consist of heating the milk or cream not less than 140 degrees F. and holding it above 140 degrees F. for a period of not less than twenty minutes.


