'DON QUIXOTE' EDUCATIONAL.
Cervantes Pokes Fun at Impractical Idealist and Tells Amusing Story.
De Wolf Hopper's debut as a motion picture star is announced for the coming week at the Casino, Tuesday and Wednesday. The long comedian will be seen as the leading member of the Tringale-Fine Arts Company presenting a film version of the Cervantes classic, "Don Quixote."
More than two months were spent in producing for the screen the story of the famous old idealist, who was too impractical to achieve his aims. David W. Griffith, under whose supervision the production was made, believes that "Don Quixote" represents a distinct step forward for film drama, and that it has a definite and positive educational value.
Most readers will doubtless remember the old Don as a middle-minded individual who tried to defeat a windmill with his lance, but came a cropper, and will recall that this had something to do with his thinking himself a knight errant riding about the world to redress wrongs. But there is much more than that to the story. Cervantes, in his satirical, not only creates a character of immortal fame and a humorous narrative that is virtually without a plot.
