

ALDEN MEMORIAL PROGRAM.

Ladies' Cemetery Aid to Present Let to Veterans for Soldiers' Monument. Special to Times-Republican. The Alden Cemetery Society, controlled by the ladies of this place, is proud, and justly so, of the condition of the cemetery. The society has made a gift of a lot in a prominent part of the grounds upon which it is intended to build a suitable memorial to the old soldiers who have bravely defended the union. How soon this will be erected is not announced. The society had planned formerly to present to the G. A. R. this lot this year as part of the Memorial program. Most of the program will be given at the Riverside park, and the parade will form at Alden Hotel corner about 1 p. m., where the public school children will join the veterans and march to the park. NO POLL TAX FOR WOMEN.

Will Not Have to Pay if Granted Franchise. Special to Times-Republican. Des Moines, May 27.—Women will not have to pay poll tax or get out on the roads and work out a poll tax if woman's suffrage carries, Assistant Attorney General C. A. Robbins says. Some of the anti's have been passing the word around that they would, so Alice B. Curtis, executive secretary of the Iowa Equal Suffrage Association addressed a letter of inquiry about it to the attorney general's office. The law provides for a poll tax of 50 cents on each male resident over twenty-one years of age but says nothing about the female. The law further says: "The road supervisor shall require all able bodied male residents of his district between the ages of 21 and 45 to perform two days labor upon the roads between the first days of April and October of each year." So there is nothing in the law that will make women liable for the payment of poll tax nor to work road poll tax even though the right of suffrage.


