HERE IS OUR METHOD

Two casings, used and useless, are combined so as to make one thoroughly serviceable casing. One of these should have a strong bead and sidewall. The other should have a fair tread, the rubber fast on the fabric. Both must be the same size, tho' it makes no difference whether they are the same make. We fasten the two, by several means, firmly together, so there can be no slipping and resultant friction. The most apparent operation is look-stitching, two or three rows of stitches being taken around the entire circumference, with a heavy gum-filled flax cord. The seam is waterproof. Dirt or sand cannot penetrate. We also furnish new tread at a small additional cost.

MARSHALLTOWN SECOND IN BATTING C. A. SEASON'S AVERAGES COMPILED

Marshalltown ranked second in hitting and third in fielding in the Central Association for the season of 1916, according to the averages of the league as compiled and made public today by A. E. Johnson, statistician of the league. Altho Marshalltown did not have a 300 hitter, the team as a whole batted .256 for the year. The batting averages follow:
