**Spider's Method of Locomotion.**  
The way a spider moves its eight legs in walking is interestingly described by a great authority on natural life. In order to observe this movement at his leisure—for it is usually too rapid to be followed by the human eye—he tired the spiders by making them swim, and then let them walk slowly over a smooth surface. And this is what he discovered: 1. The longest legs, those of the first and fourth pairs, move along lines of their own direction by vertical bending of the joints; the shorter legs of the second and third pairs move forward by rotation from the coxae—at right angles to their own directions. 2. First near leg moves with fourth off leg; second near leg moves with third off leg; third near leg moves with second off leg; fourth near leg moves with first off leg.
