TAMA RESIDENT IS MADE STATE CONSUL

City Where First Meeting of Lincoln Highway Association Was Held Becomes Location of Iowa Office — Three District Consuls Named to Aid Mr. Goodell in Improvement Work.

Special to Times-Republican. Tama, March 14.—Official report of the appointment of D. E. Goodell, of Tama, as state consul of the Lincoln Highway for Iowa, has been delayed until now awaiting the release of the item from Detroit.

Mr. Goodell accepted the appointment only after a trip to Detroit to confer with the officials as to the amount of time and work required for the position.

Three District Consuls Named. W. G. Haskell, of Cedar Rapids; A. A. Moore, of Marshalltown, and E. B. Wilson, of Jefferson, are the three district consuls who will devote much of their time and money in assisting Mr. Goodell to make this great "main street of the nation" a road fit to travel every day of the year.

Mr. Goodell has appointed F. M. Ingram, formerly county supervisor and an expert good roads man, as chairman of the city of Tama, and E. L. Beard, of Tama, as consul for Tama county, a position which Mr. Goodell himself held ever since the organization of the Lincoln way.

The state highway commission will meet the state, district and county consuls at a conference at Ames at an early date to take up the matter of federal aid and other matters of great importance to the great work to be accomplished.

The Lincoln Highway is the route selected by the government as the first road to be used as a military road and it is hoped that the people who may not live in the immediate vicinity of the road will rally with those who are thus fortunate and come forward patriotically to assist in making the Lincoln Highway a model all weather road.


