BUTTER AND EGGS TAKE BIG SLUMP

PRICES OF BOTH GO OFF RAPIDLY WITH STILL LOWER MARKET PROBABLE.

UNSEASONABLE WINTER WEATHER PRICE CUTTER

Creamery Butter Slides From 70 Down to 55 Cents—Eggs Drop From 65 to 40 Cents—Green Stuffs and Fruits Continue High — Strawberries Too High to Create Demand.

With the prices of butter and eggs going down and down below the quotations of ten days ago and with indications of still going lower if the warm weather continues, housewives are beginning to look up old before-the-war recipes in which these commodities were used. Ten days ago creamery butter was retailing at 70 cents and country butter at 60 cents a pound but this morning the former was quoted at 55 cents and the latter at 45 cents, with a possibility that the prices would be still lower, even before the end of the day. Eggs, which sold from 65 to 70 cents two weeks ago, are now selling from 42 to 48 cents per dozen and all likewise going down. Now one can have angel food cake made with a dozen eggs and not be knocked dizzy by the cost.

Green Stuff Still High.
The staple winter vegetables continue in the markets at about the usual prices but the delicacies sought by the housewife at this time of year remain exceedingly high. Head lettuce continues to sell at 25 cents for large heads and at 15 and 20 cents for the smaller ones, but hot-house leaf lettuce is on the market at 8 cents.

Strawberries "Out of Sight."
Strawberries are listed on the Chicago market but they must retail at \$1 a quart, so that local merchants do not carry them as there is no demand. Vegetables listed on the Chicago market at prices too high to create a demand locally are: Radishes, green and wax beans, egg plant, cucumbers, cauliflower, celery, and spinach. Cauliflower retails from 25 to 35 cents per head and as it has been in the market for some time is not much in demand.

Fruits Advance Steadily.
Fruits of all kinds continue high and command prices unheard of in recent seasons. Apples are getting scarce and promise to become more so as the prices advance, while oranges, grape fruit and lemons continue to increase in price. The prices of oranges vary according to size and some are selling for 50 cents a dozen. Other fruits remain at about prices of a week ago.

Friendly Enemies.
Probably the most important event theatrically of the entire season is the coming of A. H. Woods' sensational success "Friendly Enemies" to the Odeon Sunday evening.

The stirring American play has been taking the capacity of the theaters in each city where it has been shown. There is much exhilarating red fire burned in this patriotic drama, but it is not the red fire of the old time battle play, but the quiet, ready glow of modern war propaganda. It has been proclaimed by President Wilson as a timely and truthful exposition of the present European conflict. Odeon.

Civil Service Jobs for Soldiers.
The United States civil service commission is perfecting arrangements whereby men who are about to be discharged from the army or navy may receive first-hand information concerning opportunities for employment in the federal civil service. The commission has received authority from the secretary of war and the secretary of the navy to appoint its representatives at all establishments where enlisted men

are assembled in considerable numbers. These representatives are now being appointed. They will be prepared to inform the men fully concerning positions which are open, to supply them with application blanks, to assist them, if necessary, with the execution of their applications and to advise them relative to civil service matters generally. It is the plan of the civil service commission to entrust this work to educational directors of welfare organizations already operating at the camps, cantonments, etc. The representatives of the commission who are appointed from the personnel of these welfare organizations will have the benefit of the advice and assistance of the commission's local boards of examiners at nearby cities, in addition to the instructions received from the commission.

EPIDEMIC Waning

Decline of Latest Wave of Disease Seen in No New Cases Being Reported in Last Seventy-two Hours—Real Condition Better Than Reports Show.

Further improvement in the influenza epidemic situation was noticed today, with the release of one home and three patients from quarantine and no new cases reported. No homes have been placarded for the disease in the seventy-two hours ending at noon. The health department's record, at noon today, showed twenty-four homes under quarantine and twenty-eight patients suffering with the disease. These figures, however, fail to show the improvement in the situation in recent days, as some of the physicians have become lax in reporting homes released.

There are included in the list of homes under quarantine, as shown by the health department's records, at least three and possibly several more under quarantine which are known to have been released, some two and three weeks ago. A check of the report today, excluding homes and patients listed but believed to have been released, shows fourteen homes under quarantine and twenty-two patients. Thirty figures are believed to be more nearly correct. It may be, however, that some cases of influenza have not been reported to the board of health. The home of C. W. Hall, 405 1/2 South

First street, today was released from quarantine. Two patients were dismissed today from the Red Cross Hospital, leaving seven cases there under treatment.
