EXPLAINS SOLDIER EXEMPTION

State Auditor Glenn C. Haynes Writes Letter to all County Auditors.

EXPLAINS EXEMPTIONS

Gives Information as to Laws Passed by Last Legislature

State Auditor Glenn C. Haynes, himself an ex-serviceman, has written a letter to all county auditors explaining to them the laws passed by the last Iowa legislature with reference to soldier exemptions.

First: That if a person served in both the Philippine insurrection and the war with Germany he is entitled to the tax exemptions allowed to the serving in both wars—namely, to the extent of \$2,300.

EXPLAINS EXEMPTIONS

Second: That if a man who served in the Philippine insurrection, or war with Germany, marries a woman who served in the world war as a nurse, and both own property, each is entitled to the full exemption from taxation.

EXPLAINS EXEMPTIONS

Third: That if a person who served in either the Philippine insurrection or war with Germany buys property on contract by the terms of which he agrees to pay the taxes, and takes possession, he is entitled to tax exemption thereon, as the property is the property of the soldier within the contemplation of the tax exemption statute.

Fourth: That the poll tax exemption allowed soldiers of the Spanish American war was intended to cover both the per capita or head tax which is designed in the code as "poll tax," and the regular road poll tax, but that no such exemption was granted to soldiers of the late war, or what is commonly known as the war with Germany, as the soldiers of that war are limited to an exemption on property not exceeding \$500 in value.
