

Owing to Mayor Tom Johnson's fight against pool-selling, it is announced that racing at the handsome Glenville track at Cleveland, O., will be abolished after the present meeting.

Meetings of burley tobacco growers were held in 20 Kentucky towns and counties Saturday to discuss the organization plan of the Burley Tobacco Growers' Association. The capital stock of the proposed concern was originally fixed at \$2,500,000, but it is now said that this may be increased to \$7,500,000.

Fully 5,000 people from all over the dark tobacco district of Kentucky and Tennessee attended the barbecue at Gracy, Friday, which was held in the interest of the Burley Tobacco Growers' Association. Eighty-two carcasses were barbecued. Congressmen John W. Gaines, of Tennessee, and A. O. Stanley, of the Second district of Kentucky, delivered rousing speeches, which were enthusiastically received.

"Last year I raised 500 chickens, hatching them with hens and taking them away from the hens and brooding them in an abandoned hotbed," says a writer in the August Country Life in America. "Did you ever hear of making a brooder of a hotbed? No? Neither did I until I tried it last Spring, and I can truly say that I never raised finer chickens than those who passed their early life in the famous hotbed. I say 'famous,' for people came from all all around to see it. They came to laugh, but remained to say: 'Well I never!'"
