

 Dear Sir:--
 I notice an article in your paper under date of January 27th in which Mr. Plakmore of Shelbyville, Tenn., speaks very highly of Kentucky and Tennessee mules. I agree with him for mules from these two states are very hard to beat. He says while Missouri is rapidly coming to the front as a mule state she will never be able to supplant the Kentucky and Tennessee mules. She may not but I would like to say a few words in regard to our mules "out in Kansas." About 4 years ago we Taylor and Lyon sold to Mr. C. T. Bohon of Marion county Kentucky one of the best mule counties in Kentucky, two loads of mules that he shipped home, and when fed out were considered by Hudson Bros, the best two loads that left Kentucky, that year.
 We sold Mr. Bohon last fall two car loads of mules that after he fed out he sold them for \$10 per head more than any mules sold for in his county these mules were all sold to go to the southern market, and were considered exceptionally fine on that market. We have sold Mr. Bohon 14 loads of mules in the last four years, and he has been well pleased with them as they fed to lots of weight and quality. We usually handle from 500 to 600 mules every season, and make a specialty of buying the best we can get in their class and always keep a big per cent of mare mules.
 If some of the Kentucky feeders will come out we will show them mules with more weight as much quality and finish as they have in Kentucky.
