COLT FUTURITY

Announced By Catalogue Committee of K. P. Fair.

The catalogue committee of the Knights of Pythias fair, is announcing a Colt Futurity as one of the most attractive features of the splendid program which will be given. Nominations for mares are being received now, and so much interest is being taken in it by the many breeders of good stuff in Lincoln and adjoining counties, that it is believed the amount of the stake will go as high as \$100.

Mares must be nominated by March 15th when a payment of \$1 must be made. Each mare's name and color and the name of the horse to which she was bred in 1911 must accompany the entry fee.

On May 1th a payment of \$2 must be made on each mare an owner desires to keep eligible.

On August 15th the week before the fair, the color and sex of the foal must be given and a fee of \$2 paid. This is the final fee, making \$5 in all. The money will be divided into four prizes on a basis of 40 per cent to first; 25 per cent to second; 15 per cent to third and 10 per cent to fourth. It is planned to open a mule colt futurity upon the same basis, in view of the very high class hybrid youngsters which are produced in this section.

THE FARMERS

W. B. Burton bought three mare mules of John Robinson of Boyle, for \$625; five of Bud Gaines of Lincoln for \$740; a pair of Mark Setters for \$350; and 16 mules of Mac Miller of Bardstown for \$2.00 per head.

The fatal disease prevalent among stock, continues taking its toll in Garrard, especially in east and north-east Garrard.

Thomas Broadbuss, Charles Dean, Mr. Bolton, Mrs. Mary Sanders, William Kay, Miley Walker, Henry Ray, James Simpson and a number of others have lost valuable horses from the malady and mules and cattle have also been stricken.

Dr. R. L. Pointers, the competent veterinary surgeon, finds the disease curable when treated in its first stage, and reports its symptoms similar to meningitis as indicated in human beings. He claims that it is not due to eating mouldy corn, as stock that have never been fed maize have died of the disease. Dr. Pointers believes the epidemic is traceable to a germ made prevalent by the unusual climatic conditions of the last few months.

W. B. Burton bought 25 head of four to six year-old cotton mules from Baird and Mann, of Lexington at an average of \$200, per head. Mr. Burton has exported 18 carloads of hybrids since the opening of the season, making his shipments to North Carolina, South Carolina and Richmond, Virginia.

V. A. Lear bought 16 250 pound hogs from Logan Burke at 5 3-4c per pound; 10 100 pound shoats from Maurice Sutton at 4 3-4 cents and 20 200 pound porkers from John Bogie at \$4.90 per hundred.

J. W. Elmore sold 100 bales of clover and timothy hay, to J. W. Sweeney at \$20 per ton and a lot of mixed hay to W. C. Greening, of Parsons, Kansas, at \$15 per ton.

V. A. Lear bought a four-year-old mule from a local trader at \$142.50. R. E. Thompsons sold \$650 worth of corn to Banks Hudson at \$3.50 per barrel. The Alexander Bros., sold a lot of corn at the heap in the field at from \$3 to \$3.25 per barrel.

Mr. Sweeney Morgan is feeding 200 fine shoats at his farm near the Lincoln boundary. He bought about 500 barrels of corn for fattening his swine. The following being some of his purchases: 250 barrels from Taylor House at \$2.50 per barrel; 40 barrels from James Bryant at \$3; 35 barrels from Dan Williams at \$3 delivered; and 40 barrels from W. P. Gill at \$3 delivered; Most of the maize was bought before the late rise in the price of corn.

Teater and Hicks sold a bunch of heifers to a local buyer at \$26 per head.
