LEADS DUAL LIFE UNTIL CAPTURED

Remarkable Career of John Joseph Kean.

Kidnaper of Fred Muth Wanted for Bank Theft and Other Crimes in New York.

THEOLOGICAL STUDENT ONCE

Philadelphia, June 20.—Kidnap, bank robber, embezzler, petty thief, wife deserter, confidence man and probably burglar.

This is one side of the character of Joseph Kean who at last faces life imprisonment for kidnaping little Freddie Muth.

Inventor, author, theological student, mathematician, chemist. That is the other side of his character. The 42 years of Kean's life have been crowded with exciting episodes.

Kean has stolen one fortune, made another and lost both on the race track and in stocks. His desperate course in capturing the Muth boy was to prevent his arrest for embezzling \$320 and the police say to provide entanglement.

Robbed a Bank.

Kean was a student in a theological institution in New York. Then he entered the office of a real estate broker. He was quick at figures and went ahead rapidly.

When questioned upon this Kean promptly admitted that he had taken the money. He came to Philadelphia twelve years ago, taking a house near where the Muths live.

Embezzled Collections.

He then procured a position as bookkeeper. He soon lost this and began living by his wits, and under the guise of promoting questionable enterprises worked a confidence game upon several of his acquaintances.

This was in the early part of last October and Kean lived comfortably until he became involved in an affair with a woman in the neighborhood. This taxed his resources and he began to hold back the rents he collected for his own use.
