A squall struck the river yesterday afternoon shortly before 6 o'clock, breaking the pole that holds the dry docks out in the river, and blowing the fleet to the bank. No damage was done by the wind though two towboats were propped up on the dry docks. The men had quit work at 5 o'clock, but a small crew was at work on the Nolle. Simultaneous almost with the squall that struck Paducah, a strong wind blew the Tennessee against Eads bridge at St. Louis.

The Lee line may have to enter a third boat in the Memphis-Cincinnati trade to handle the business. On the arrival of the Georgia Lee here last evening, every berth was taken and cots were scattered all over the decks. Twenty Paducah passengers could get nothing better than cots. The packet has slightly more than 200 persons aboard. If these packets are crowded when they reach Cairo, as they have been so far, it means that Paducah and all other points above can get no accommodations, or at best have to shift in cots. With a good stage of the river indicated for some time to come, this line would make money by entering a third boat. The Jim Lee, a fine side-wheel boat, would relieve the situation, if she could be spared from other lines. Captain Phillips, the local agent, will lay the situation in Paducah before the officers of the company. Already he has over 40 berths engaged for week after next. A party of 14 will come from Dresden, Tenn. Many parties have come from the surrounding small towns.

The phenomenal passenger business has been enjoyed by all the lines. The Kentucky brought in nine round-trippers last night, who came up from Murray last week to take the Tennessee river trip. Low water is the only thing that will stop the business for the Chattanooga packets, and the Evansville and Cairo line is doing as well.

Reports show the big rise of 17 feet at Pittsburg yesterday. This means good water for several weeks with the prospect of more rain. The Tennessee river is coming up and not a single packet has quit from low water this year. They may be able to run until the fall rise insures good water until next spring. The river rose 1 foot here since yesterday. The stage this morning was 14.2, after a rainfall of .14 inches. The stage on July 19 last year was 8.0.

The Nolle looked like a pig that had been wallowing in the mire when first raised from Clark's river. Under the skillful paint brush of Freddie Smith, son of the captain, this towboat on the docks looks as if her first trip was yet to be made. Freddie is only 12 years old but has done all the painting on the Nolle and the boat's name on the engine room, painted by him, would reflect credit on a veteran painter. The Nolle will get off the dry docks tomorrow.

The John Hopkins did not arrive last night and probably will skip a trip to get on time. The Joe Fowler will arrive this afternoon from Evansville and return today.

The Lyda returned from Joppa last night with empties and left today for the Cumberland river after ties.

The Martha Hennen will leave today for the Tennessee river after ties.

The Fulton returned from Cairo last night with 15 empties and left this morning for Louisville. The Fulton stopped here to get firemen.

The Peters Lee will pass down from Cincinnati for Memphis Saturday afternoon.

The Kentucky is in from the Tennessee river and will leave Saturday evening on another trip. Lumber six feet deep on the decks, cattle and produce made the Kentucky low in the water.

The Harvester is at Cincinnati on the way down with coal for the West Kentucky Coal company, and all the towboats have fine water.

**ABDICATES**  
KOREAN EMPEROR SURRENDERS HIS THRONE.  
Pressure of Mikado's Government Forces Him To Retire After Hague Incident.  
Tokio, July 19.—Dispatches from Seoul says the emperor convened the elder statesmen at 1 o'clock this morning. Cabinet ministers waited in an adjoining room while the emperor conferred with the elder statesmen. After a two hours' conference his majesty finally yielded and made up his mind to abdicate.  
It was decided to hold the abdication ceremony at 10 o'clock this morning.  
Much unrest prevails about the palace and at another place a crowd of 2,000 is assembled. A portion of this crowd assaulted the office of the Daily Kokumin, but the mob was dispersed before heavy damage was inflicted.
