TOM LOFTUS STILL ALIVE AT FULTON

Former Paducah Character Holds on a Long Time.

Is Remembered by Many Paducah People Who Knew Him Well In by-gone Years.

A LATE PEN PICTURE OF HIM.

The Fulton Commercial of yesterday paints a pen picture of a man who for years was one of the best known characters in Paducah. He was a town character when Paducah was only a town and was not a stranger to the police. His name was Tom Loftus.

One of the older citizens estimated today that Loftus must have drunk about 8000 barrels of whiskey in his day. He must be close to 70 years old and has never taken any care of himself.

"During the high water in '84," said this old citizen, "Loftus waded all over this town even during the cold nights and performed all kinds of work for people whose property was endangered. Yet he was never sick and today probably has a stronger constitution than many men who have taken care of themselves."

Loftus is now however nearing the end of all accounts.

The Fulton Commercial says of him:

"If you want to see one of the most pitiful sights you ever looked upon go to the city lock-up and take one look, just one, for you won't want another at its occupant, Tom Loftus. The old man with his unkempt hair and beard, his wild blood-shot eyes looks like some wild creature, as he beats upon the walls of his cell in a vain endeavor to get at an imaginary foe. He sees all sorts of animals, reptiles, etc., and his cries, curses and entreaties are pitiful to hear. All day long a crowd of curious men and boys have surrounded the jail, some to jeer the unfortunate victim of the drink egress, others to speak a kind word. There is no better example of the drink evil than this. Loftus comes of a good family, his sister being a wealthy resident of St. Louis. This sister came to Fulton once and offered to take care of Tom if he would give up his liquor. This he refused to do and he has now reached such a stage that there is no possible chance for reformation. It is a matter of speculation as to whether his mind will be cleared when the spree is over or whether he is doomed to spend the remainder of his days in the mad house."

A NEW ANAESTHETIC.

London, August 11—A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Geneva states that Prof. Redard and Prof. Emery have discovered a new anaesthetic for use in dentistry. Experiments to learn the effects of colored lights upon the nerves revealed that blue light is extraordinarily soothing. A patient was put in a dark room and his eyes were exposed to a sixteen candle power blue light for three minutes. This caused him to lose the sense of pain and the tooth was then painlessly extracted, without the after-effects of ether or chloroform.

BERTILLION SYSTEM

Chief Collins Says it Would Greatly Help Local Force.

Criminals Greatly Fear Cities Where the Measurements are Taken.

The local police have done good work in capturing and aiding in running down criminals, but are greatly handicapped by having no Bertillion machines with which to take measurements.

Chief of Police James Collins was talking yesterday of the method and says if the city would put one in at the city hall, much better work could be accomplished. This system is as perfect as possible to secure. The machine takes the exact measurements of a criminal and in this way celebrated criminals who have changed their names and appearance have been detected. A criminal fears a city where such a system is in vogue even more than bloodhounds.

Chief Collins once asked the city to put in the machine, but the expense was then too great, the city being without any surplus funds. The police will ask for an appropriation next year and urge the boards to buy a Bertillion machine.
