Our News Summary.

Thirteen delegates are already nominated for President. The Courts of Kentucky have enjoined the drawing of lotteries in this State. Crop accounts from all parts of Georgia are favorable. A Washington correspondent reports to the effect that Judge L. S. Trimble of this district, had declared for Chase for President, says it is untrue and absurd. He is for the nominee of the New York Convention, whoever that may be.

Presidential.

General McClellan writes to Essex that he is not a candidate for the nomination, but will give him or any other good Democrat a hearty support. To the Convention the Convention, so-called, consisted of 47 white men and 74 negroes. The State Legislature on joint ballot will stand 44 white men and 98 negroes. The whites and blacks are just upon a level.

Texas.

The Reconstruction Committee will report favorably on the proposed bill to divide Texas into three States, but it is believed that Congress will do nothing this summer which would enable Texas, Virginia, or Mississippi to participate in the Presidential election.

The U. S. Senate, has passed the Arkansas bill over the veto by a party vote, and notified the House of the fact and sent the proper certificate with the new law to the State Department.

Case Concerning Chief Justice Chase's private Secretary, that he would accept the nomination of the National Democratic Convention on a platform embracing certain principles, is named.

We demand in the name of the fathers of the Constitution, and for the sake of posterity not its reconstruction, but the restoration of that sacred instrument, which has been to all of us a pillar of support, and upon which we have relied, and in all solemnity, before God and man, under a full sense of the responsibility of all us, we do hereby protest against this new proposed copartnership of military dictators and negroes in the administration of this government.

As the newspapers now have it, the contest for the nomination seems to be between the two distinguished gentlemen from Ohio, but they mean to do better than this, that apparent support which leading politicians have lately been giving to Judge Chase will prove in the end to have been given as a means of breaking down Mr. Pendleton, and that the idea of getting Chase and Judge Old Greenback like a hot potato, and bringing out some man who has been kept comparatively in the background, and nominate him with a rush. The gentleman who will probably be the nominee of the Democratic party in New York, Thomas A. Hendricks, Samuel Nelson and Horatio Seymour.

The Democrats are anxious to best Grant in this election, and we are afraid that neither of these three men can do it. Chase might carry the day with his Republican recruits in the North, and with the immense strength he would bring to the Democratic party in the South. Pendleton, too, with his philosophy respecting bonds and greenbacks, would run far ahead of his party in all the Western States, and even with some deductions from his enormous Democratic preponderance in New York, he might fairly hope to carry that State also. But Seymour, while he would have a thundering majority in New York, could not possibly carry the Northwest, and Nelson and Hendricks, excellent men and wise statesmen as they are, would excite no enthusiasm.

These facts are well known to all intelligent Democrats, and hence we conclude that the idea of getting Chase and Pendleton against each other till they are tired, and then putting through some less conspicuous man, is one not easy of execution; for this reason, we will still think that the Democratic candidate of Old Greenback will be nominated in spite of everything.

Some people think that the lot may possibly fall on General Hancock, but the notion is futile. He can win no nomination, and if he were, he probably could not be elected. He is young yet and full of vigor. He can wait. If a compromise candidate is the nominee, we are of the opinion that the only representative anti-radical man, whose character would excite a proper degree of enthusiasm, and upon whom all elements could unite. We fear it is not likely that the Democratic party will have a better chance than the conservative Republicans and old war Democrats, and soldiers, will not support him, and if Mr. Chase or General Hancock, that the Democratic will vote. These elements are already supporting Mr. Johnson. It is our course during the war, and the sympathy and support of the North, soldiers, and his bold, patriotic course in defense of constitutional liberty, excite the unbounded admiration of all good Democrats.

We are indebted to Hon. L. S. Trimble for copies of Congressional Globe, and other valuable public documents. Our people can look with pride upon the present noble position of our member of Congress. Last week, he engaged in an able defense of Mr. Young and the people against the disgraceful but too successful efforts of McKee—upon himself, which reflects honor upon himself.
