SAMUEL J. TILDEN. The Sage of Greystone, Departs This Afternoon. Death Comes Suddenly to the Aged Leader—The Country Loses One of Her Foremost Statesmen.

YONKERS, N. Y., Aug. 12.—Samuel J. Tilden died at Greystone this morning a few minutes before 6 o'clock. He had been enjoying his usual good health up to last Saturday evening. While sitting on the steps of his residence after sundown on that evening he was taken with a slight chill, which settled on his stomach and bowels, producing inflammation. The cold settled in the stomach and he was unable to eat anything. On Sunday evening he felt much worse, and continued to grow weaker, but until last night there were no fears of the consequences. This morning it became apparent that Mr. Tilden had been suffering from a severe attack of cholera.
