



The 15th annual meeting of the West Kentucky Baptist Association, after a three days session at Poplar Grove, closed Friday. Attendance was larger than usual, but the good people of Poplar Grove neighborhood entertained the delegation royally. Of the thirty-one churches in this association, all were represented. Two new churches were organized last year, but only one was admitted, this one being Valley Spring church of this county.

Annual reports from the different churches were read and all are in a growing and prosperous condition.

The churches have an aggregate membership of about 4,000.

The Rev. R. W. Mahan, of Clinton, is the moderator, M. E. Dodd, of Fulton, is clerk and Dr. D. M. Singletary, of Clinton, is Treasurer.

Before the meeting adjourned, prohibition and state politics came up for consideration and discussion. Some declared that all prohibitionists should vote the straight prohibition ticket while others pleaded for the democratic ticket as the safest for prohibition interests.

All discussions were on a high plane and much enthusiasm was aroused for the general work. The next annual session will be held near Bardwell, Ky.
