**MUST CANDLE EGGS**

Board of Health Makes Order. Is Effective May 15 to Jan. 15.

The recent order of the State Board of Health requiring the candling of eggs in Kentucky between May 15 and January 15 of each year goes into effect at once.

The order says that between May 15 and January 15 of each year all eggs in the market, or intended for market shall be handled only on a candling basis, and no payment either in cash or merchandise shall be made for eggs until so candled.

A statement must be made in duplicate by the buyer of each package of eggs, showing the number of good, damaged and bad eggs in each lot, one copy of which shall be given to the person from whom the purchase is made, and the other to be kept on file for one year, and subject to inspection at all times by any health or food inspector.

During the warm season all eggs must be kept in a cool place and all lots of greater than 30 dozen must be packed in strong standard egg cases and filled, well protected from breaking and all cracked eggs must be packed in separate cases from those with sound shells.

The order says that no person, firm or corporation shall sell, offer for sale or expose eggs for sale, or have in their possession for the purpose of sale any eggs unfit for human food, unless they are broken in the shell and then denatured in such a way that they cannot be used for food. A candling certificate, dated and signed, must be with each case of eggs, between the dates the order is in effect.

**DR. RUDD NOT INDICTED.**

After hearing the evidence in the cases, the Grand Jury failed to indict Dr. R. T. Rudd, of Fulton, who was held under bond and to answer to about a half dozen charges growing out of the smallpox cases at Fulton last winter. He was specially charged with failing to report to the County Board of Health cases of smallpox, as required by law. This resulted in a long, tedious examining trial before Judge Stauffer, and the court finally held the physician under bond.
