FARM AND HOME NEWS FROM OVER KENTUCKY

Lee county farmers recently planted 1,500 trees on their farms in one month according to County Agent T. H. Jones. Work put on in the county during the summer just past by the county agent and the extension division of the College of Agriculture at Lexington is held largely responsible for the interest that farmers of the county are taking in the development of their home orchards.

The drive staged this last summer against huffer hens in McCreary county flocks by the extension division of the College of Agriculture at Lexington has been brought to a successful close with the completion of the twelfth culling demonstration, the last of a series held to show farmers and their wives how to distinguish between the good and poor layers in their flock. Four hundred and ninety-three hens were handled in the twelve demonstrations, 202 being discarded because they showed the characteristic sign of being poor producers, according to County Agent W. B. Woodward.

Twelve Fayette county farmers will co-operate with County Agent W. H. Gabbert and the extension division of the College of Agriculture during the coming year on putting on beef cattle feeding demonstrations on their farms to bring out practical pointers on the fattening of cattle for other farmers of the county.

Union county farmers living in the Waverly community, co-operating with County Agent L. C. Brewer, will use organized community efforts in attempting to get at the heart of some of their farm and home problems. One hundred and fifty of them attended the meeting when the Community Club was formed and the program of work outlined. This is the seventh community in the county to adopt a similar line of work.

FULTON LANDS CIGAR FACTORY

D. Weiss and N. Weiss, high officials of the American Cigar Co., last week signed an agreement with Fulton business men to locate a cigar factory in that city as soon as the necessary building can be erected. It is said the factory will be larger than originally estimated. Present plans call for a building 98x149 feet, with facilities for 400 girls. This is much larger than the cigar factory at Dyersburg, it is claimed.
