NOTICE OF SALE BY SPECIAL MASTER.

Notice is hereby given, that pursuant to a decree of foreclosure and sale, made and entered by the circuit court of the United States, Ninth circuit, district of Montana, on the fourth day of March, A. D. 1901, in a certain cause pending in said court, entitled Massachusetts Loan and Trust company, complainant, vs. Butte City Water company, defendant, the same being numbered 104, I, Henry N. Blake, as special master, appointed by said decree, will sell at public auction to the highest bidder, at the front door of the court house of the county of Silver Bow, in the city of Butte, state of Montana, at 12 o'clock, noon, on Monday the twenty-second day of April, A. NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION. Notice is hereby given that an election will be held on Saturday, the 6th day of April, 1901, in School District No. 1, Silver Bow County, Montana, for the purpose of electing three (3) school trustees for the term beginning on the third Saturday in April, 1901, and ending on the third Saturday in April, 1903.

The following question will also be submitted to the registered voters in said school district, to be voted upon at said time, to-wit: "Shall bonds be issued and sold to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), bearing four (4) per cent interest, redeemable in ten (10) years and payable in twenty (20) years, for the purpose of purchasing school lots and building school houses thereon?"

The polling places at which said election will be held in said school district are as follows, to-wit: For School Election District No. 1, consisting of Registry Precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4, the polling place will be at the Blaine school house, situated in Centerville, Montana.
