NEW YEAR BRINGS HIGHER FOOD COST

Supply of Canned Goods Dwindles—Small Items Jump Remarkably.

Anticipation of rises of a number of staple food products, no declines and little change in prices this week signalled the advent of the new year.

While the eastern potato market has expanded in recent weeks it is not the opinion of local dealers that the price will change until the weather permits eastern shipments.

The canned goods situation is explained in a letter to one of the local dealers from a local Pacific coast jobber.

"First of all you must realize that the unfavorable weather conditions during the growing season produced a shortage of from 15 to 40 per cent below the normal pack, and as many of the growers' contracts provided for a certain percentage of delivery a number of them were forced into the open market to buy from some other source."

"We do not look for any reaction from the present high prices because when the actual shortage is fully realized the selling we anticipate another when we will not overlook that a large number of consumers who buy in bulk and buy in advance of the season of canned goods."

"The greatest shortage, particularly with the Maine pack which in some sections was almost sold out, was the green peas which in the most extraordinary years, pertaining to canned food lines. Many times in the past we have found ourselves at short supply of this item in the line of our business."

The bill is expected to pass the House of Representatives in the near future.

MAN WHO KILLED BULGAR UNKNOWN

Coroner's Jury Fails to Fix Responsibility for Death of Bulgarian.

Coroner Lane's jury failed to place responsibility for the fatal stabbing of Ivan Svetcoff this noon at the conclusion of an inquest into the Bulgarian's death which has been in progress for several days.

The jury merely found that Svetcoff succumbed to hemorrhage and shock incident to a knife wound inflicted on the night of Dec. 25 at the international cafe, a coffee house at Galena and Wyoming streets, by some person unknown.

No hearing held in the county ever developed more conflicting testimony or more evasion than did the Svetcoff inquest.

Witnesses, a dozen or more of them subpoenaed from the 20 or 30 more Turks, Bulgarians and Balkan states men in the coffee house on the night in question, failed to agree on any single material detail of the free-for-all fight which climaxed with the stabbing of Svetcoff.

Some told of seeing Hessaam Hallam, a Turk who is sought by the police, with a knife, and others declared that Svetcoff told them that John Rife, one of the proprietors of the place, had stabbed him.

None would say that they saw Svetcoff stabbed, although they admitted seeing him a moment before and as he clasped his hand to his side shouting that he had been stabbed and reeled to the floor.

That Svetcoff had been involved in a difficulty with a Turk earlier in the evening over payment of 25 cents developed at this morning's concluding session of the inquest. It also developed that while the free-for-all was in progress Svetcoff was swinging a billiard cue right and left, wielding it on everyone who came within path of its falling course. It also developed this morning that Steve Chink, who was stabbed in the back with a miner's candlestick during the fight, had a large part in starting it.

Sefir Demir, Asim Dailip and Abduraman Kadir all testified this morning that Svetcoff was swinging a billiard cue during the fight; that Rife did not pass by Svetcoff until the latter had fallen to the floor and that Chink was both active in starting the fight and keeping it going.

At the county attorney's office it was stated today that no complaints will be filed in connection with the case until a more thorough investigation.

WOMAN POSTMASTER IS BEST RECRUITING AGENT

Washington, Jan. 5.—Vina C. Mullins, postmaster at Wilder, Tenn., was the army's best individual recruiting agent during December.

Under the section of the national defense act appointing postmasters recruiting agents, she obtained six recruits for the regular service from a town of 500 population. The government pays \$5 per man.

"If one-twelfth of the number of postmasters available as recruiting agents had done likewise," a war department statement said, "the regular army would now be considerably in excess of the authorized strength."
