

Up and Down the State

A conference of the county superintendents of schools of the state will be held in Helena, Jan. 25-26, called by Miss Trumper, state superintendent.

Demonstrating that Montana grown corn will put the fat on hogs in fully as quick time as feed grown in the eastern states, a Phillips county farmer recently butchered two 9 months old hogs that yielded 521 pounds of meat and 13 pounds of lard.

J. Philip Anshutz, the rector of St. Luke's church at Billings, has been appointed the head of the diocese of Montana of the \$5,000,000 pension fund that is being raised by the Episcopal church throughout the country...

The Corvallis State bank has been sold to M. G. Kern, R. Ray and Otto R. Hoken, all of Corvallis. It is said that the transfer will result in the establishment of a farm loan association.

Important changes were made in management of the First National bank of Conrad at the last meeting of the directors. In addition to changing the cashier and several directors the capital stock of the bank was increased from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

A delegation from Chinook and the farmers from the country to the north have left for St. Paul, where they will interview Louis W. Hill, president of the Great Northern, in an effort to induce the company to build a branch line from Chinook up Red Rock creek into the country north of Havre.

Because St. Vincent's hospital is crowded and many patients are clamoring for admission, the physicians of

Billings admit they are facing a serious situation. It is claimed that the Billings hospital facilities are not adequate for a town of its size.

Park county tax payers have formed an association to be known as Park County Taxpayers' association. The object is for the mutual protection of the members.

Hereafter the three theaters in Missoula—the Empress, Bijou and Isis—will be operated under one management, one house being closed except for special attractions when the others are open.


Contracting for the 1917 crop of sugar beets has been started by the Great Western Sugar company of Billings and more than 2,000 acres have already been signed up. The factory officials say that the increase of \$1 a ton over last year assures a larger acreage than ever before.

Townsend now boasts of one of the best stockyards in the northwest. The new yards have a capacity of 10,000 sheep, which will give shippers some idea of what they will accommodate in other grades of stock.
