Up and Down the State

The Missoula council proposes to tax each taxi and autobus \$10. The present ordinance provides for a tax of \$25 for the first car and \$5 for each additional car owned by one man or any company doing a taxi business.

The incorporation of the McCree-Langer Land and Investment company has been completed at Plentywood. The capital stock of the concern is \$50,000.

Nearly 500 men are on the pay roll of the Republic Coal company at Klein, near Roundup, and the production now breaks all previous records. The company is taking out on an average of 15,000 tons of coal each week.

Manhattan is said to be the only town in the state that boasts of a six-acre playground for its school. The school authorities are developing the playground work.

Within the past week 15 cases of typhoid fever have been reported at Harlem and a general epidemic is feared.

The Yellowstone Park Film company has been organized at Gardiner, where it will have its main office. It is proposed to take pictures of the immense herds of wild game now in that vicinity.

The Homebuilders' Investment company of Havre has had a prosperous year, according to the first annual report. The company has \$77,000 paid in capital.

The Pulson Chamber of Commerce wants cities which own their public utilities to be allowed to fix the rates therefor. The matter will be presented to the legislature by a committee from the chamber.

At a recent meeting of the alumni of the University of Michigan residing at Great Falls it was decided to establish a scholarship fund for the purpose of sending some deserving persons to the university each year.
