## FARMERS OF IDAHO LEAVE FOR CANADA

Special Trainload of Families and Stock Pass Through Butte Today.

A special train of 16 emigrant cars, carrying 20 families, their stock of horses and cattle and household goods, arrived this afternoon over the Oregon Short Line at 2:30 o'clock en route to Lethbridge and Besancon, Canada; to farms purchased from the Canadian Pacific Railway company, a small exchange for the hundreds of Canadian citizens who crossed the line into the United States when the land of the maple leaf expressed the opinion that every able-bodied citizen was morally bound to join the armies of the allies.

H. H. Beckley, assistant district superintendent of the Canadian Pacific, with headquarters in Spokane, arrived early this morning and will accompany the trainload of emigrants to the northern country and remain with them until they are located on their farms. It is said that the land has been purchased at from \$20 to \$50 an acre in varied amounts. The emigrants will be housed for the night in small local hotels and will leave in the morning on the Great Northern at 7 o'clock for Canada. All of the men of the party are claimed to be practical farmers who have some money to invest.

While there is no indication that the Canadian Pacific is conducting a special campaign to re-settle those districts of Canada depopulated by the enlistments in the army, it is understood that a very extensive campaign is being waged by the Canadian railway to interest Americans in the farm lands of the western portions of the Dominion.
