## SPRING USHERED IN BY BLIZZARD

Only One Winter Since 1889 When Snowfall Exceeded That of 1916-17.

Today, the first day of Spring, was ushered into this section of the country with a whirlwind and a two-inch snowfall. The piled up snow of the winter was whirled in eddying clouds and repelled into drifts of many feet deep, interfering in the early morning to a slight degree with the operation of the street cars for the first couple of hours. Snow or rain is predicted for tonight with fresh winds and little change in the conditions tomorrow. Thus far the March snowfall has been 10 inches, which, compared with the records of former years, is nothing remarkable for the month of blustery winds.

According to the weather records as far back as the winter of 1889, there was only one winter in which the snowfall in Butte exceeded the snowfall so far during the present winter, which may equal if not surpass that mark before the month has passed. Since last October up to noon today the snowfall, according to the official figures, was 5 1/2 inches. The record mark is 8 1/2 inches for the winter of 1903-4. The greatest March snowfall on record was in 1904 when 20 inches fell during the month. The smallest March snowfall was in 1911 when only two inches of snow fell. There has been snow in every March for the past 18 years. The heaviest snowfall in any one month in Butte during the past 18 years was in February of 1904 when 29 1/2 inches were recorded.

Reports from other parts of the state indicate that while there has been severe weather in some of the former winters, the present winter has been more sustained and continuous than in any other year and that the winter months have been especially severe for cattle on the range. In fact, there is serious risk of a big loss in cattle at the present time. The smallest snowfall of any one winter in Butte was in 1901-2 when only 1 1/2 inches were recorded for the entire winter. Some of the figures are missing for that year but it is believed that the snowfall did not exceed 20 inches. The next smallest snowfall was in 1914-15 when 24 1/2 inches were the mark.



## SOUTHERN VETS IN THE PARADE

Former Confederate Soldiers Will Take Part in Washington Demonstration.

Washington, March 21.—One of the most remarkable demonstrations in the history of any country—a demonstration which is expected to show all the world that the last vestige of sectional feeling in the United States has been wiped out—is being arranged to take place here next June when the veterans of the confederate army will march in a grand parade along historic Pennsylvania avenue.

This leading thoroughfare of the nation's capital has been the scene of many military parades, but never up to this hour has it witnessed a parade of those who fought against the Union. The coming reunion of confederate veterans will be the first reunion to be held north of the Mason and Dixon line since the civil war. It has been an inviolable rule with the veterans that all their reunions be held in the south. The invitation extended by Washington's representatives at last year's reunion at Birmingham, Ala., proved so alluring and irresistible, however, that the veterans decided to meet here this year.

Fifty-three years ago gray-clad confederate soldiers were not at all welcome in Washington and their endeavor to visit the national capital were met with stubborn resistance at Fort Stevens on upper Georgia avenue.

Today, however, things are different. Confederate soldiers are as welcome as the flowers in May and several hundred Washington business and professional men are busy as bees arranging for the twenty-seventh annual reunion of the United Confederate Veterans, as their association is called. The gathering of the southern warriors, which will begin June 4, will be memorable in many respects. It is estimated that 30,000 or 40,000 veterans who followed Lee, Jackson, Johnson, Longstreet and other southern chieftains will participate in the business sessions and parade here.

As usual, the veterans will be accompanied by the cream of southern beauty and aristocracy in the persons of lovely sponsors, maids of honor, daughters of the Confederacy and a host of other visitors. It is expected that fully 150,000 or 200,000 persons will come to Washington to participate in or witness the reunion and its innumerable social affairs.

Representative men of Washington are organizing to develop ways and means to give the southern hosts a royal welcome to the capital. Executive and finance committees have been formed and have begun their efforts to make the reunion a success. The sum of \$50,000 has been fixed tentatively as the amount necessary to make the reunion one of the most notable of all confederate assemblages. The subscriptions already received amount to many thousands of dollars. The railroads of the south have conceded a rate of one cent per mile for the coming reunion.


