13.34 INCHES OF RAIN IN TWENTY-FOUR HOURS

Streets of Hawaiian Towns Are Rivers—Damage is Heavy.

Honolulu, March 21.—Heaviest rains here in years during the last 48 hours undermined foundations of buildings and did other damage. Streets in the lower levels were running rivers. Bare-legged Kanaka boys caught fish in the main streets of Waikiki.

Reports of roads and bridges washed out and property damaged generally were received from other islands. A cloudburst on the island of Hawaii washed bodies out of their graves in a Japanese cemetery and flung them over canyons.

Weather bureau records for 24 hours ending near last midnight showed a precipitation of 13.34 inches of water.

Loss of life, so far reported, was confined to the death of one Japanese woman in the cloudburst on Hawaii. During the downpour the inter-island steamer Maui went on the rocks of Makalawana island and is a total loss with 19,369 bags of sugar aboard. There is a hole in her bottom and she was pounding hard on her beam ends. Officers and crew abandoned her.

FIVE KILLED IN TORNADO THAT SWEEP ARKANSAS

Little Rock, Ark., March 21.—Five persons were killed and four others seriously injured in the tornado which swept a small section near Delart, Ark., early today, according to reports received here.

GOTHAM YEARLY EATS FOOD WORTH A BILLION

New York.—The feeding problem of New York City will be appreciated when it is realized that there are counting permanent residents and the "strangers"—nearly 6,000,000 and that they devour in a year's time from \$800,000,000 to \$1,000,000,000 worth of food.

NATION-WIDE MAIL COUNT IN APRIL

Government Will Check Up on Cost of Handling Parcels Post Matter.

Every piece of parcels post matter dispatched from and received at the local postoffice during the first two weeks of April will be counted, weighed and classified as a result of a department order received by Postmaster Goodwin. This will serve as the semi-annual check on the parcels post system to determine its profit and loss and the counting will be simultaneous with the count in offices all over the country.

The task of keeping count and check on the parcels post matter received for the two weeks will be no easy one. Each piece must be classified as to weight, zone for which it is destined and amount of postage. Time employed in the handling of this matter will also be kept and a detailed report will be made to Washington.

About April 1 the local postoffice will receive a carload of catalogues, about 70,000 in all, from a big New York mail order house for distribution in Butte and various points in Montana and Idaho in the immediate vicinity of Butte. These catalogues are shipped to Butte by freight, delivered at the local postoffice and under permit are dispatched by parcels post from the local office. This involves distribution and segregation which will probably require about three weeks. The postage on the catalogues will be about \$4,000 and this is credited to the showing of the Butte office in the matter of postal receipts.

Last fall about 57,000 of this particular firm's catalogues were dispatched from the Butte office. The mailing list, however, has increased about 2,000 since then.

New York, March 21.—Almost \$300,000 was spent by the railroads in newspaper advertisements during the recent eight-hour controversy with their men, but not the \$3,000,000 that brotherhood leaders charged before congress was so employed. It was announced here today by Frank H. Fayant, who is in charge of publicity for the national conference committee of the railroads. Complete accounts just made up, he said, showed that \$295,000 was used for advertising "or a little more than \$1 for every mile of railroad in the country."



OLD FRIENDS FALL OUT; ARRESTED

E. F. Roe and H. O'Neill Accuse Each Other of Making Threats to Kill.

E. F. Roe and Harry O'Neill appeared as complaining witnesses against each other this morning, each claiming the other made threats to kill, at O'Neill's home, 59 West Mercury street.

"He knocked at my door and when I answered he dared me to come outside and said he would kill me," said O'Neill. "I went to my tool box, got a gun and chased him out of the house."

Roe claimed that his wife and mother-in-law were waiting for him to get home about 4 o'clock the other morning and that O'Neill, who lives in the same house, told Mrs. Roe if she didn't go to bed and quit making a noise he "would blast her."

"I waited for him to apologize and when he didn't do it voluntarily I decided to make him do it," said Roe.

Judge Whitty discovered that the two defendants have been friends for years. When they promised to shake hands and forget their troubles the court suspended a fine of \$50 in each case.

All other cases pending in the police court were continued until the afternoon session.

BUDGET QUESTION TO BE CONTINUED

Council Committee Wants Full Information Before Action is Taken.

The ways and means committee of the city council to date has taken no action regarding the city budget. The matter will most likely be postponed, although it was at first planned to have the budget ready for tonight's meeting of the council.

Because of the primary election, the members of the committee have been too busy during the past two or three days to perfect the budget plans.

It is well known that the city's revenue has been cut materially during the past few months. Fines from the redlight district, which amounted to more than \$20,000 per year, have been eliminated. Many merchants have refused to pay their license tax.

The committee, before it takes action, wants all the details regarding the condition of the city's finances. The firemen have asked for a raise in pay and their request was continued until the time for a new budget came up.

City Treasurer Neal A. Ward is working with the committee and is furnishing many of the details required before final action is taken.
