TO OUST KAISER FROM YACHT CLUB Notice Will Be Given Him and Prince Henry That They Will Be Dismissed.

New York, March 22.—The Atlantic Yacht club after much discussion has found a way to oust Emperor William of Germany and Prince Henry of Prussia, both of whom have been honorary members for several years. The club's constitution provides that before a member may be dismissed he must be given an opportunity to defend himself against charges. The directors of the club have decided that the rule will not be broken if they notify the emperor and the prince by publication that they are to be dropped from the rolls. If neither replies within 10 days they will be declared no longer members.

deeper into things admit that the Germans will obtain economic advantage, an improvement of the front and a gain of time by this move. Difficulties of Offensive. "The British, however, must again begin the preparation of their offensive. Their heavy artillery must be moved ahead with enormous protections. Roads and bridges must be constructed, often under hostile fire. Ammunition transport will be possible only in a very slow fashion. The condition of the evacuated territory makes any advance movement difficult, as it does the lodging and provisioning of the troops and observation work."

"They will reproach us with the charge that we acted like the Russians in Poland. As to this, France may settle accounts with England. The law of our warfare is and will be that everything necessary and possible in a military way will be done in this defensive war. Whether the population of the war theater suffered more through our measures or the enemy's measures may be asked them in the time to come."

BAD WEATHER IS BIG FACTOR IN FIGHTING London, March 22.—Telegraphing from the British army headquarters in France today Reuter's correspondent says: "Wintry conditions continue on the western front, with considerable falls of snow, rendering field operations difficult. The bad weather, however, is as unfavorable to the Germans as to ourselves, as they cannot get observations on the strength or direction of our advance."

"This advance during yesterday and last night was of the same character as on the previous day; that is to say, it was most rapid along the front of about 20 miles extending southeastward from Arras."

Cavalry Hangs on. "The latest report is that our cavalry patrols were in contact with the German rear guards within five miles of the outskirts of St. Quentin. The enemy's resistance was most active in the sector between Arras and Ypres, the latter place being defended by a series of strong points."

Machine Gun Posts. "Between Ypres and Croisilles, a distance of some 10 miles, the retreating Germans hold a series of machine gun posts, but we are getting up our field guns in excellent style and not much difficulty is anticipated in reducing these. In fact, there already is a pretty deep bulge eastward in the enemy's line at this part, reaching to Beaumont-Lez-Gamrai, which considerable village was occupied by our troops yesterday. This carries our advance to a point some four miles north of Ypres."

GERMANS MAKING AN ENERGETIC RESISTANCE Paris, March 22.—The Germans made energetic resistance to the French last night between Somme and the Aisne, but after spirited fighting north of Eregner the French forced them out of several strong positions. The French occupied a number of villages."

HARD FIGHTING AS THE TEUTONS RETIRE Berlin, March 22 (by wireless to Sayville).—Spirited fighting in the sector over which the Germans have been retiring is reported in today's official communication, which mentions no further evacuation of territory. French battalions attacking on the north bank of the Aisne were repulsed."

GERMANS MAKE HARD ATTACK ON RUSS LINE Petrograd, March 22 (via London).—A vigorous German attack was made yesterday on the Russian front in the direction of Lida, near the Beresina river. The war office announces that the Germans gained considerable ground, although substantially part of this territory was recovered. The statement follows: "In the direction of Lida on the river Beresina in the region of Sabarezya and Potaschnia, the enemy after a bombardment of long duration attacked our positions and occupied them. By our counter attacks he was driven out of Potaschnia. The other part of the position remains in his hands."

RENEWED ACTIVITY ON THE RUMANIAN FRONT Berlin, March 22 (by wireless to Sayville).—A revival of activity on the Rumanian front is reported today by the war office. On the Russian front, east of Lida, German detachments advanced to the second Russian trenches over a front of four kilometers (2 1/2 miles) and captured more than 200 Russians."

TALK OF BUYING WITNESSES FOR GILL (Continued from Page One.) began habits of the underworld, whose existence depends on police protection, have hung about the federal building, seeking scraps of conversation that could be magnified into testimony for Mayor Gill and the policemen on trial. The grand jury's investigation would extend deep into the police force, Reames said.

Tense Feeling. There was a tense feeling in the court room when the trial of Mayor Hiram C. Gill, Chief of Police Charles L. Beckingham and Detectives Peyer, Poolman, Doom and McLennan, charged with conspiracy to violate the federal laws by importation of liquor into the state of Washington, was resumed this morning. Counsel for the defense announced that the defense wished to argue a motion that the prosecution be re-opened and Logan Billingsley be recalled for examination by the defense relative to alleged efforts he had made recently to obtain testimony for the prosecution. The jury was removed and arguments proceeded. The government formally opposed the motion, but the judge granted it.

Billingsley Recalled. When Logan Billingsley was recalled it became apparent that he had been in close touch with the United States officials in everything he had done or said outside the court room recently. He said that Eddie Metzdorf had told him the police had raised a fund of \$300, to help the mayor and the policemen on trial, and that Watson H. Smith had been approached as a witness to confirm the testimony of Hansen, Hazlett and Russell, to the effect that Arthur Hatton, former bookkeeper for the Billingsleys, had been with them, and not with the Billingsleys, on Aug. 30, the day on which Hatton testified, he was in the Billingsley room when Logan picked up \$4,900 and said he was going down to see the "old man."

Buying Testimony. Logan Billingsley insisted today on making his answers long enough to get in something about a police "frame up" on him. He told the cross-examiner that Metzdorf had told a story to the police for which he got \$100, but that later Metzdorf had told the truth to the government and that he would tell the truth now if called to the stand.
