CLOSE ARGUMENTS IN O'MALLEY CASE

Fate of Young Man Charged With Murder in Hands of the Jury.

The fate of William O'Malley, charged with the murder of John McNamee of Walkerville on the early morning of Oct. 22 at Smith's roadside, will be in the hands of the jury about 5 o'clock this evening. When court opened this morning the instructions were settled and then read to the jury. Chief Deputy County Attorney N. A. Robertson began the opening argument in behalf of the state at 11 o'clock. Mr. Robertson reviewed the evidence, pointing out to the jury the testimony of the principal witnesses for the prosecution, and drew the conclusion that O'Malley was the man who made the assault on McNamee which resulted in the latter's death. He asked that the jury, in view of the evidence, return a verdict of guilty. Mr. Robertson concluded his address at the time of the noon recess.

This afternoon Attorney William Meyer made the opening address in behalf of the defense. He contended that the evidence as to how McNamee received the wound which resulted in his death is of an uncertain character and said that under the circumstances there was nothing for the jury to do but to return a verdict of not guilty.

Attorney E. M. Lamb is to follow Attorney Meyer and the closing address will be delivered by County Attorney Joseph R. Jackson.

DEAL FOR PURCHASE OF BUSINESS IS CANCELLED

Louis Kaufman has been relieved of the responsibility of taking over the business of the Western Mining Supply company. A few weeks ago Mr. Kaufman appeared in Judge McClellan's department of district court and paid over \$12,000 as the purchase price of the supply company. Yesterday Mr. Kaufman asked that the sale be declared off and that his money be returned. The request was granted and the court made an order for the return of the money. The mining supply company is in the hands of a receiver and E. F. Farnham as receiver has been directed by the court to ask for new bids for the purchase of the property.

WOMAN HELD, SUSPECTED OF BEING GERMAN SPY

Atlanta, Ga., March 22.—Federal officers today caused the arrest on suspicion of Mrs. A. T. Edden, a young German woman who had been traveling with Valerian Johannes Pieszyanski, taken in custody here yesterday, along with Hugs Coustou. The two men said they were walking around the world. Pieszyanski on a bet, and Coustou as time-keeper. Suspicion that the trio might be German spies was the cause of their arrest. Federal officers said they also had requested Chattanooga police to arrest A. T. Edden, whom the young woman under arrest here says, she married in San Diego, Cal., after walking there from Salt Lake City with Pieszyanski. Salt Lake City, March 22.—The projected 22 miles of concrete road across the mud flats of the Great Salt Lake Desert by which the Lincoln Highway association will make a boulevard of the only impassable stretch on the new route through this state was assured today when it was announced that \$7,500, the first installment for the project, had been deposited by Henry B. Joy of Detroit, president of the Lincoln Highway association, with the Utah State National bank. Actual work on this stretch will begin as soon as weather permits.

SECTION HAND SUES RAILWAY COMPANY

Thomas Bolla, a section hand in the employ of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway company, has brought suit against the company asking for judgment in the sum of \$12,000 for injuries he alleges he received through not having been furnished with sufficient help to move a rail weighing 1,900 pounds.
