STERLING PIONEER; THOMAS BURKE DEAD

Native of County Mayo, Ireland, Honored Citizen, Passes Away.

Anaconda, March 27.—Thomas Burke, one of the most respected of the citizens of Anaconda, a man who had lived here for 35 years and had won the admiration of all who knew him, passed away this morning at St. Ann's hospital at the age of 87 years of illness incident to old age.

Mr. Burke was born in County Mayo, Ireland, in 1830. When a mere lad he emigrated to the United States, first settling in Oswego, N. Y.

The surviving relatives are six daughters: Mrs. C. A. Noble of Kalamazoo, Mich.; Mrs. T. J. Meloy of Anaconda; Mrs. E. J. Boxer of Spokane; Mrs. W. C. Madge of London, England; Mrs. T. F. Jensen of Anaconda and Miss Alice Burke. The funeral will be held at an hour to be announced later from the residence of Mrs. Jensen.

ACTING GOVERNOR WILL APPEAL FOR RECRUITS

(Continued from Page One.) The war department would not have demanded that each company be recruited up to a war footing, but that the minimum number of men for each company, 65, would have been acceptable and would have been sufficient.

Will See First Service.

"Those who enlist now will see first service," said Captain Anderson, "for the national guard, consisting of from 250,000 to 300,000 men, is the nation's first line of defense.

Ten Days to Mobilize.

It is predicted now that mobilization of the guard will not be complete for at least 10 days more. The regiment must be recruited up from approximately 800 men to 2,002, and despite the fact that response to the call for recruits has been good, details of enlistment, including medical examination and the like, will consume at least 10 days.

Many Would Join Navy.

Numbers of men during the past few days have been inquiring at the Butte postoffice for enlistment in the navy. Several who have seen service and are subject to call as reservists have reported to the postoffice.

Recruiting Office Hours.

The local recruiting office for the national guard will be open every day now until mobilization is complete from 9 o'clock in the morning until noon; from 2 o'clock until 5 o'clock in the afternoon, and from 7 o'clock until 9 o'clock in the evening.
