

STRAIGHT GRAIN PRICES

The Rallies, Based on the Crop Condition Reports, Fail to Hold.

Chicago, March 30.—Predictions of unsettled weather in Nebraska led to hopes today of a breaking of the drought there and caused wheat prices to ease off. On the decline, however, steady buying for cash houses was much in evidence and brought about a reaction. The market was decidedly nervous. Opening prices, which ranged from the same as yesterday's, finished 1/16 lower with May at \$1.94 1/2 to \$1.98, and July at \$1.85 1/2 to \$1.86 1/2, were followed by a material advance all around and then a moderate upturn.

Help of export business at Baltimore helped the bulls a little, but, too, did continued unfavorable crop advices from Nebraska and Kansas, but the rallies failed to last. The close was heavy 2 1/2 to 3 1/2¢ net lower with May at \$1.95 1/2 to \$1.95 1/2 and July at \$1.85 1/2 to \$1.85 1/2.

Corn weakened in sympathy with wheat. Support was lacking. After opening unchanged to 1/2¢ lower, the market underwent a general rise but showed something of a rally. Transient strength developed substantially owing to the fact that the market had become bare of offering. The close was weak at 1/2 to 1 1/2¢ net decline.

Oats displayed relative firmness. Commission houses were fair buyers. Record breaking high prices on hogs lifted provisions to new high levels. In advance, though, induced much selling to realize profits.
